

Larkin's Kippah



Note: This kippah is a little larger in diameter than most kippahs and is designed so that the edge has a little bit of grab to it, to help hold the kippah to a head that doesn't have much hair to pin it to.

H hook

1 ball of Peaches & Creme worsted weight cotton yarn will make several.

st=stitch

ch=chain

sc=single crochet

dc=double crochet

slst-slip stitch

(...)=repeat the stitches within the parenthesis

[...]=alternate notation for the repeated stitch section

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ch 5 - Join with slst to form ring.

Round 1: ch 1, 10 sc in ring. slst in ch1 (10 stitches total)

Complete the following rounds in the back loops only until stated otherwise.

Round 2: ch 3, dc in joining (2dc in each stitch around) slst in ch3 (20 stitches total)

Round 3: ch3, 2dc in next st (1dc next stitch, 2dc next stitch around) slst in ch3 (30 stitches total) [1-2]

Round 4: ch3, dc next st, 2dc next (1dc next 2 sts – 2dc next st around) slst in ch3 (40 stitches total) [1-1-2]

Round 5: ch3, dc next 2 st, 2dc next (1dc next 3 st – 2dc next st around) slst in ch3 (50 stitches total) [1-1-1-2]

Round 6: ch3, dc next 3 st, 2dc next st (dc next 4 st – 2dc next st around) slst in ch3 (60 stitches total) [1-1-1-1- 2]

Round 7: ch3, dc next 4 st, 2dc next st (dc next 5 st – 2dc next st around) slst in ch3 (70 stitches total) [1-1-1-1-1-2]

Round 8-12: complete 5 rows of 1sc in each stitch around in both loops.

Cut a 4-6 inch tail and weave in ends.
